Creating Committees as a Path to Leadership

Develop Committees as Path to Leadership

Develop written job descriptions – not the "ideal" (what the most perfect would be) but the realistic description with <u>monthly specific calendar</u> of what must be attended to.

Ask Chairs and Directors to Form Committees as a path to leadership. Start with small portions of a job, develop self-confidence and become more familiar with leadership expectations.

Asking someone to serve on a specific committee often does not get you the results you desire. Try asking them to do a specific job on a specific committee. Below are some tasks as a jumping off point for creating your own committee specific tasks.

Develop Leadership Through Committees – suggested tasks that can be taken on by individual members to form a specific committee.

Public Policy

write letters and event/s or a specific event

make calls write articles

keep track of lobbying efforts

Membership

membership event chair collection of names

manning station at events – AAUW and non

writing invitations making phone calls

meeting/greeting new members

new member orientation - coffee and questions

promoting membership incentives

Program

take one program – responsible for all of it

be venue contact for all programs

introductions be responsible for thank you note and recognition

Secretary

recording corresponding bylaws

Divide other officer or committees to involve your members and assist your leaders.
