Easy Driving Directions to Honor's Haven Resort in Ellenville, New York

From New York City, Long Island and Northern New Jersey:

George Washington Bridge to New Jersey Palisades Parkway to New York State Thruway North; proceed on Thruway to Harriman, Exit 16; follow Route 17 West to Exit 113; then Take Route 209 North 12 mi. After 12 miles turn, SLIGHT RIGHT onto Country Club Rd. Then turn right onto Arrowhead Road. Bear left through the Honor's Haven entrance and follow the road to the left (not the access road to the far left) up to the main entrance of the hotel. Enter through the front gate and check in at the front desk.

From Upstate New York (from North):

Take the NYS Thruway South to Exit 19, Kingston. Thruway exit to traffic circle, take the first right, approx. ½ mile. Get onto Route 2O9 south to Ellenville (approx. 27 miles). Follow signs to Nevele and turn left onto Arrowhead Road. Bear left through the Honor's Haven entrance and follow the road to the left (not the access road to the far left) up to the main entrance of the hotel. Enter through the front gate and check in at the front desk.

Need a ride? Short Line (Coach USA) offers daily scheduled service from New York City, Long Island, The Catskills, Binghamton, Ithaca, Elmira, Utica and more! Individuals departing from NYC can board at Port Authority (42nd Street & 8th). It is recommended that you arrive at Port Authority (2nd floor North Building) not less than 30-minutes prior to your scheduled departure time. LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND FUNDRAISER GUIDELINES

The LAF Fundraiser has become a fun tradition at the convention, providing a social venue, friendly competition, and an opportunity to raise funds for women fighting sex discrimination in the workplace. In the past, we have auctioned baskets and raffled purses. This year, we are giving greater freedom to the branches in choosing the types of items they submit. A submission could consist of a basket, a purse, or something else. For each submission, the contributing branch can also choose whether to get it raffled or auctioned.

The rules to participate are simple:

- Each branch can enter up to **3 items** (purse, basket, or something else).
- Prior information is necessary for entry: how many items to be entered, what they are, their titles, and whether they will be auctioned or raffled. Information should be sent to Nancy Mion by the deadline: FRIDAY MARCH 28, 2014.
- A 4"x6" card should be attached to each item giving the title, a brief description, the contents if any, the name of the contributing branch, and whether the item will be raffled or auctioned.
- All items must be in the Display Room by 5 PM Friday, April 25, 2014.

Drawing tickets for raffled items will be available in the Display Room at a cost of \$10 for 2 tickets. The minimum starting bid for an auctioned item will be \$20, with minimum increments of \$5. The winners of auctioned items will pay at pickup time, cash or check – check preferred. The money made by each item will be credited to the branch that contributed the item. The Display Room hours for viewing items and bidding on Friday and Saturday will be provided in the convention schedule.

The winners can pick up the items during Sunday breakfast. All items must be picked up by 10 AM on Sunday April 27, 2014. We look forward to your entries, and to a fun event!

DETAILS:

- 1. Each branch should set up its exhibit and sales between 12:00 noon and 6:00 pm on Friday, April 25.
- 2. Do not display items before 12:00 noon when the area is officially opened and branch areas have been designated.
- 3. The branch is required to have one or more of its members stay with the exhibit during the official hours the Branch Exhibit Area is open if items are for sale or at any time items of value are displayed at the table.
- 4. The Branch Exhibit Area will be **open** on Friday, April 2,5 from 4:30 pm to 6:00 pm. It will also be **open** on Saturday, April 26, from 4:30 pm to 6:30 pm. Sales will take place during these times and tables must have a branch member in attendance.
- 5. Exhibits will be on display all of the time.
- 6. Branches should remove their posters and sale items by 10:00 pm on Saturday.
