Use this form to submit contributions to AAUW Funds or the AAUW Action Fund. You may copy or download this form from the member center at http://www.aauw.org/member_center/forms/contribution_report.cfm as needed.

- Step 1 **List the donor information** (name and complete address) for each contribution submitted with this form. If the donor is a branch or state, include the leader's name and address and please state that the gift is a branch gift in the *Notes* column.
 - This information assists staff in keeping donor records updated and enables AAUW to send the tax receipt to the donor. Branches and states are also encouraged to send personalized thank you notes to donors.
- Step 2 **Enter the gift amount.** This amount must match the amount on the donor's check or the branch check.
- Step 3 **Enter the fund code number** for the contribution. If the donor does not specify where the contribution should be applied, AAUW considers it an unrestricted gift. See the attached list of fund names and numbers by program area.
- Step 4 **Enter the Branch and State to be credited.** All AAUW branch member donations are credited to the member's primary branch and state. If a donor wishes to credit another branch or state instead of her or his primary branch, list that branch code number. If the donation is from a branch, the branch will receive credit automatically.
- Step 5 Add notes to inform staff of special instructions regarding this gift (e.g., this contribution is in memory or honor of someone, send this donor a pin, this donor has already received a pin).

- 2505 National Conference for College Women Student Leaders. Attendees develop their leadership skills, net- works, and ambition at this acclaimed, intensive three-day conference held annually in Washington, D.C.
- 2515- Campus Action Projects. AAUW awards grants to campus leaders to deliver programs guided by the findings and recommendations of AAUW research to address a gender-based issue in their community. Replicable or ongoing projects are selected to provide continued leadership training and support for women leaders.
