STEM Education

This year we decided to become involved with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) because AAUW has made this a priority. Our initial meeting in September 2011 addressed this topic with a presentation of the research report "Why So Few" by Nancy Mion.

In November 2011, physicist, Dr HelioTakoi, Brookhaven National Laboratory discussed STEM and what we can do to involve more women & girls.

Our March 2012 program will feature a woman pharmacist who will talk about her career, medication and how we can encourage girls to enter this field. Unfortunately, at almost the last minute, she was unable to present so we were fortunate to have a woman speak on Breast Cancer and the Environment. We hope/plan to have the original program next year.

Understanding the need, the branch believed this was an area where we could attempt to make a difference. A Committee was established to investigate opportunities to do this. The Committee has contacted the Girl Scouts, especially since this is their 100^{th} Anniversary, and has been discussing how to work most effectively in this area. Another possibility is working with a local science museum on a STEM related project involving girls.

Branch members are encouraged to make a commitment to the girls in their lives to be open to entering STEM fields.

My Sister's Keeper

This is the 2nd year we have been involved in MSK AAUW NYS Project. Up until last March we had been involved in 13 activities. Since then we have engaged in 12 more. (A list can be sent to you if you wish). Our members are more aware of women around the world and the problems they face. They have become involved in contacting legislators and individually support organizations that benefit women globally. Members have a greater understanding and sensitivity to this issue. They will continue to include it next year's planning.
