- Last date to file Opportunity to Ballot petitions: April 17
- Federal Primary Election: June 24
- First date to circulate independent nominating petitions for federal office: June 24
- Dates to file independent nominating petitions for federal office: July 29 to Aug. 5
- General election: Nov. 4

## June 24: Congressional Primary Day

I have asked **Jane Pfeiffer Russell** from the Bath Branch to provide support to NYS Branches who may be facing a Congressional Primary in June. Jane is a former Voter Ed and Public Policy Director for AAUW-NYS and our nominee to be Program VP for 2014-16.

About one-third of NYS Congressional Districts are competitive and at least two will have an open seat in November – NY 4 and NY 21 - with the retirements of Carolyn McCarthy and Bill Owens. And even if your district is not running a Primary, you are still advised to start thinking now about how you will educate voter about the issues, the candidates, and do voter registrations. Who are the partners in your branch area?

These are the NY seats we've identified as potentially competitive: 1, 2, 4, 8, 11, 13, 19, 21, 23 and 24. If you live in another, please share that information with both Jane (<a href="mailto:homechick@empacc.net">homechick@empacc.net</a>) and myself!

## NYS Legislature Elections

2014 is a state-wide election year with all 213 legislative seats up as well as the office of Governor. At least 11 NYS seats are now open. There appears to be no move on Gov. Cuomo's part to call a special election, so over 1 million NYers have no representation in the state budget deliberations this spring. If these are still open seats come November, the local elections will be very exciting.

## Women's Equality Agenda Update

The Women's Equality Coalition is gearing up for the new legislative season. The Steering Committee has resumed meeting weekly by phone and occasionally in person.

**LATE BREAKING NEWS!** "Today, the New York State Assembly built on its longstanding commitment to New York's women and girls by passing the full Women's Equality Act. By moving swiftly to prioritize the package of legislation, which was first proposed last year and did not become law, the Assembly has made it crystal clear that women's lives are a priority."
