The Hour of Code is a one-hour introduction to computer science, designed to demystify code and show that anybody can learn the basics. Thanks to the AAUW Public Policy Impact Grant AAUW-NYS received for 2014-15, we have extra funds to share to achieve our objectives under the grant. The three areas we are working on include 2014 Get Out the Vote work, the Common Core, and Title IX: STEM Education promotion.

This application can be completed by any member within any branch or college/university partner associated with AAUW-NYS. It can also be completed by two or more branches working collaboratively. Branch public policy chairs, Program VPs or other leaders, or pertinent AAUW Interest Group Chairs can apply.

Each \$50 Mini-Grant is designed to help you put on an Hour of Code activity for girls in conjunction with **Feb. 20: Girl Day - Introduce a Girl to Engineering Day** during **DiscoverE**, **held Feb. 22–28: Engineers Week**. A total of ten (10) Mini-Grants will be awarded.
