

Campaign College is the only training in the country that encourages and trains young women to run for student government on their college campuses.

Campaign College is a day-long training held on the college campus that teaches college women how to run for and win student government positions at their schools. The training covers skills such as how to mobilize your constituency, how to craft your message, and how to speak and present yourself confidently as a candidate. The Campaign College staff bring in outside experts to speak to the students, as well as current and former student government officials from the college where the training is taking place. The Campaign College training addresses the disparity between the high percentages of women in colleges and universities and the low representation of women in student government. With Campaign College, we want to give more young women the valuable experience of running and serving on student government, as there is a clear connection between service in student government and future political service.

Background

In the fall of 2006 the American University (AU) Women & Politics Institute was made aware of that while American University's student body was 62% female, women made up only 28% of the AU Student Government (AUSG). Galvanized by this significant low representation, the Institute, together with the student government's Women's Initiative, launched *Campaign College*: AU Women to Win. Subsequent to the first *Campaign College*, there was a 43% increase in women's representation in the AUSG. Expanding on this pioneering AU-campus-based effort, the Women & Politics Institute partnered with AAUW to leverage its national network of branches and college/university partner members to disseminate the program and Running Start with its expertise in assisting young women to run for elected office. By encouraging more young women to run for student government during their college years, Campaign College prepares women for local, state and federal office candidacy.
