Serve as a leader at the AAUW New York State Leadership Development Conference by:

- Participating in the conference planning process
- Promoting and publicizing the conference on your campus and beyond
- Attending the New York State Leadership Development Conference (expenses paid by AAUW)
- Organizing and hosting conference networking activities
- Providing on-site conference support to participants as peer leaders

Student Qualifications and Application

AAUW-NYSSAC Members Must Meet the Following Qualifications:

- · Attend a two- or four-year accredited institution in New York State
- Demonstrate strong communication, interpersonal, planning, and writing skills
- Possess student leadership experience (on- or off-campus and in your community)
- Have a basic understanding and interest in women's equality issues
- Be eager to network and exchange ideas on the monthly conference calls, via e-mail, Facebook, and in person at the NYSAC leadership conference
