

DISTRICT III CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN ITHACA AT THE MUSEUM OF THE EARTH



AAUW-Ithaca will host the 2105 District III Conference on Saturday, October 24, between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM at the beautiful Museum of the Earth/Paleontological Research Institution (MOTE/PRI). The theme of the event will be science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) for girls in different age groups; the title of the conference is *From Mud Pies to Dinosaur Bones: Encouraging Girls' Interest in STEM*.

The morning schedule includes:

- **Sara Silverstone**, Director, Empire State STEM Learning Network Finger Lakes Regional Hub, presenting a general overview of research on girls and STEM;
- Ellie Fulmer, Assistant Professor, Education Department, Ithaca College, and Sally Wolfe, Educator, discussing STEM for preschool and elementary school girls;
- Patrice Prusko, Instructional Designer in Academic Technologies, Cornell Information Technologies, describing Massively Open Online Courses (MOOCs) for middle and high school girls.

Branch member and NYS Program VP Jane Russell will cater a gourmet lunch made from fresh, local ingredients. The cost of the meal is included in your registration fee.

After lunch the line-up includes:

- Illa Burbank, President of IthacaSTEM Advocates, discussing STEM for high school girls;
- Warren Allmon, Director of the Paleontological Research Institution and its Museum of the Earth, on Katherine Palmer's, the second PRI director's, life and work;
- A self-guided tour of the Museum; admission is also included in your registration fee.
