THE TIME IS NOW



Jump Start program receives the **MetroFund Grant**

Earlier this year, the AAUW-NYS Board submitted an application for a Metro Fund grant to support a Professional Jump Start event developed in conjunction with AAUW-NYS Student Advocate, Liz Brady. Liz is a recent Colby College graduate who has served on the state board for about a year and whom has provided insight into the current day struggles facing new college graduates. Inspired by her story and upon reflection of our own current or past career

experiences, we began to discuss ways in which to address the challenges emerging female professionals face as they "jump" into the workforce and how the beginning of one's career can greatly impact their life-earning trajectory. We saw a need to provide these young women with important

information surrounding the wage gap, while also providing them with effective skills to move forward into the career world with confidence. The end result was the

development of a day conference incorporating salary negotiations, motivational speakers, and skills sessions on professional and effective use of social media, developing ones resumes, interviewing, and preparing oneself for the expectations of the workplace.

We are pleased to announce that the Professional Jump Start program has received a MetroFund grant in the sum of \$19,500 and we are planning to host the inaugural

District IV kick off year with a Parade for Women's Equality

District IV started off their program year with a parade for Women's Equality Day on August 26 on Glen Street in





Glens Falls, New York. The events were organized by a committee of Adirondack AAUW members. About 125 AAUW

members, other women's organizations, and community participants walked the city block twice, behind 7 members of the Glens Falls city band. Adults and children made posters on the Equality theme, had them judged by John Strough, Queensbury Supervisor, and were awarded prizes.

Three young women won. Two candidates running for office did short speeches from the Library steps.

Following the parade, there was a brunch at the Queensbury Hotel where state AAUW President Janice Brown spoke on pay equity. Also, Alice Paul and Inez Mulholland made an appearance as well as an anti-suffragette doctor. Our

district IV AAUW members were part of an audience of 79 enjoying the brunch.

The third event for the District IV conference took place at the Hyde Collection, our world famous art museum where 66 folks heard Dr. Carolyn Stanfanco, President of the College of St. Rose in Albany, spoke on Women's Equality, especially overcoming challenges. Dr. Roberta Reardon, Director of the Department of Labor employees, talked about pay equity. The day finished with Docent tours of the Jane Peterson collection and Women Landscape

artists, women who painted in the early 1900's and were virtually forgotten as artists by their male peers. AAUW Adirondack sent the district attendees home after lemonade and cookies. All who attended had fun and were challenged by the information and possible programming ideas were presented.

southern shore of Lake
Otsego. Made famous as
"the Glimmerglass" in
James Fenimore Cooper's
Leatherstocking Tales, the
nine-mile-long lake is the

source of the Susquehanna River.

Built by brothers and
Cooperstown benefactors Edward
Severin Clark and Stephen Carton
Clark, the Otesaga opened in 1909
and from the start provided gracious
hospitality, first-class
accommodations, and fine dining.
The resort boasted the latest in
modern conveniences and
engineering. There was, for example,
a refrigerator cooled with 30 tons of

ice, a telephone in each room, central heating that could be individually adjusted, and 400 windows from which visitors could admire the area's lush surroundings.

The Clarks were no strangers to building prominent structures. They owned, for example, the famous Dakota apartment building in Manhattan's Central Park West. Their Grandfather, Edward Cabot Clark, a lawyer, had amassed the family's fortune by partnering with Isaac Singer, founder of the Singer Sewing Machine Company.
