Scrapbooks are valuable tools for preserving branch activities and memories.

A. STATE SCRAPBOOK PROJECT - CONTINUING FOR 2011-2012

Share your branch activities with others!

Your branch is requested to provide three scrapbook pages (six counting front and back - must be 8.5 by 11 inches). Make sure the pages you use are archival safe. (Some paper is now labeled as archival safe or acid free. Scrapbook supplies are a good source, as are office supply stores, but check the labels.) Use your best "scrap booking" techniques, but give a good representation of your branch activities for the year.

If your branch has not given us scrapbook pages in the past, this can still be done. For branches that have given us copies of your scrapbook pages, please continue to do so. All pages will be put into the AAUW NYS archives.

Complete the first two pages (front and back) for display by the state historians at the NYS Convention in April. These pages should highlight your branch activities for the year 2011-2012 up to convention time. Newspaper articles (copied on archival safe paper), pictures, programs, or whatever, can be used. When possible, be sure to include names for pictures. The pages will not be returned, so you may want to give us a copy of them. If no one from your branch is attending the convention, mail the pages to Helen (addresses below) by April 1.

Complete the last scrapbook page and mail it, or a copy of it (it will not be returned), to Helen by the end of June. This way we will have a record of your entire 2011-2012 year.

Anything your branch believes is relevant to highlight and preserve your branch activities, projects, and membership.

The scrapbook should be kept in the branch archives.

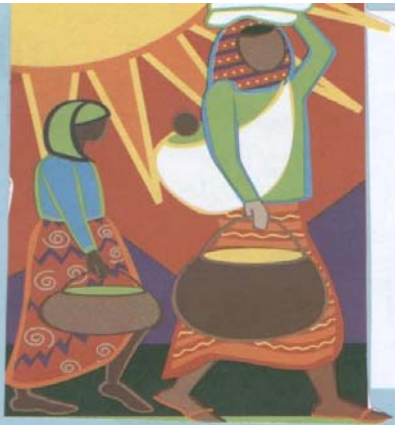
