View The Facts:

Pioneering college graduates founded the American Association of University Women (AAUW) more than a century ago when popular wisdom held that higher education impaired women's health. AAUW's first research debunked that myth, and ever since we have paved the way for women to earn their degrees and achieve their dreams.

Donna Shalala, former secretary of the US Department of Health and Human Services, credits an AAUW Educational Foundation grant she won with jump starting her career.

When Christy Brzonkala filed suit against two football players who allegedly raped her in her college dorm, she relied upon the AAUW Legal Advocacy Fund for legal funds.

The late Representative Patsy Mink (D-HI), who drafted Title IX-the law prohibiting sex discrimination in education- was an AAUW branch member.
